



John Fardell visits Northern Ireland schools for 20th Anniversary of Scottish Friendly Children's Book Tour

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2018 marks the 20th anniversary of the <u>Scottish Friendly Children's Book Tour</u> and, from 22 to 26 January, as part of the all-star anniversary celebrations, John Fardell will visit pupils in Northern Ireland for a wonderful week of school events. This is the second year of the Scottish Friendly Children's Book Tour in Northern Ireland following a highly successful debut with famed author Lari Don last year.

The Children's Book Tour is supported by Scottish Friendly, one of the UK's leading financial mutuals, and organised by Scottish Book Trust, the national charity transforming lives through reading and writing. The tour visits both primary and secondary schools, and has enthralled more than 100,000 children since it began in 1998.

John Fardell will visit 10 schools and over a thousand pupils, including Ardnashee College and School, where students are aged from 3-19 years-old and have a range of additional special needs. A full list of schools involved is available below.

Inventions and adventure play a key role in all of John's books. His most well-known books include *The 7 Professors of the Far North* and *The Day Louis Got Eaten*. He has won the Scottish Children's Book Award twice, and in 2009 won the Royal Mail Children's Book Award for *Manfred the Baddie*. In his sessions, John will show pupils the imaginative process behind his picture and illustrated children's books.

Commenting on the tour, John said:

"I'm really excited to be heading off on the Scottish Friendly tour of Northern Ireland. I've got great memories of my previous tour some years ago, to schools in Inverclyde and Clackmannanshire, and it'll be lovely to be out on the road (and ferry!) with Scottish Book Trust team once more, especially as part of this fabulous programme's 20th Anniversary year."
